It is with great pleasure that I write to tell you that I have heard your radio station, Radio Rhino International - Africa. This is the first time that I have heard your station. Please accept this report of my reception of Radio Rhino International - Africa. I hope you will find it of interest.

I heard Radio Rhino International - Africa on 11 October 2003 from 1520 to 1559 UTC on a frequency of 17,555 kHz. Your transmission was through the broadcasting facilities of Deutsche Telekom in Juelich, Germany.

Your signals were of moderate strength. There was no interference to your signal. The strength of your signal faded up and down moderately. There was a slight amount of atmospheric noise, which affected reception. Overall reception quality was fair.

I am 53 years old. I am married. My wife's name is Susan. I have two children, a boy aged 23, and a girl aged 20. Their names are Adam and Jennifer. I have been a shortwave listener for 30 years. My receiver is an RX-340, made by Ten-Tec. My antenna is a longwire 20 meters long. Listening to shortwave radio is my hobby. I enjoy listening to foreign radio stations on shortwave.
